







Can you find all 10 differences in these spring pictures?

You can take a picture of you completing the activity or a picture of your finished product.


Your teacher will then provide you with a stamp code to upload on to your Passport to Learning.

Accessing your 'Passport to Learning':

- · Go to www.childrensuniversity.co.uk
- · Click on 'Login' found in the top right of the page
 - · Select 'login as a child'
- · Enter the username and password that your coordinator provided
- · When you first log in, you will be asked to reset your password which must be a minimum of 8 letters, and contain a capital letter, a lower-case letter and a number.

Once you have logged in, this is an outline of what your passport looks like:





To log your hours:

- · Get the stamp code from the teacher running the club
- Once you have completed your activity and got your code, click 'add a stamp'

- · Select the code colour
- \cdot Type in the code number (e.g. BLUE3412) and press enter
