How Many Tens and Ones?

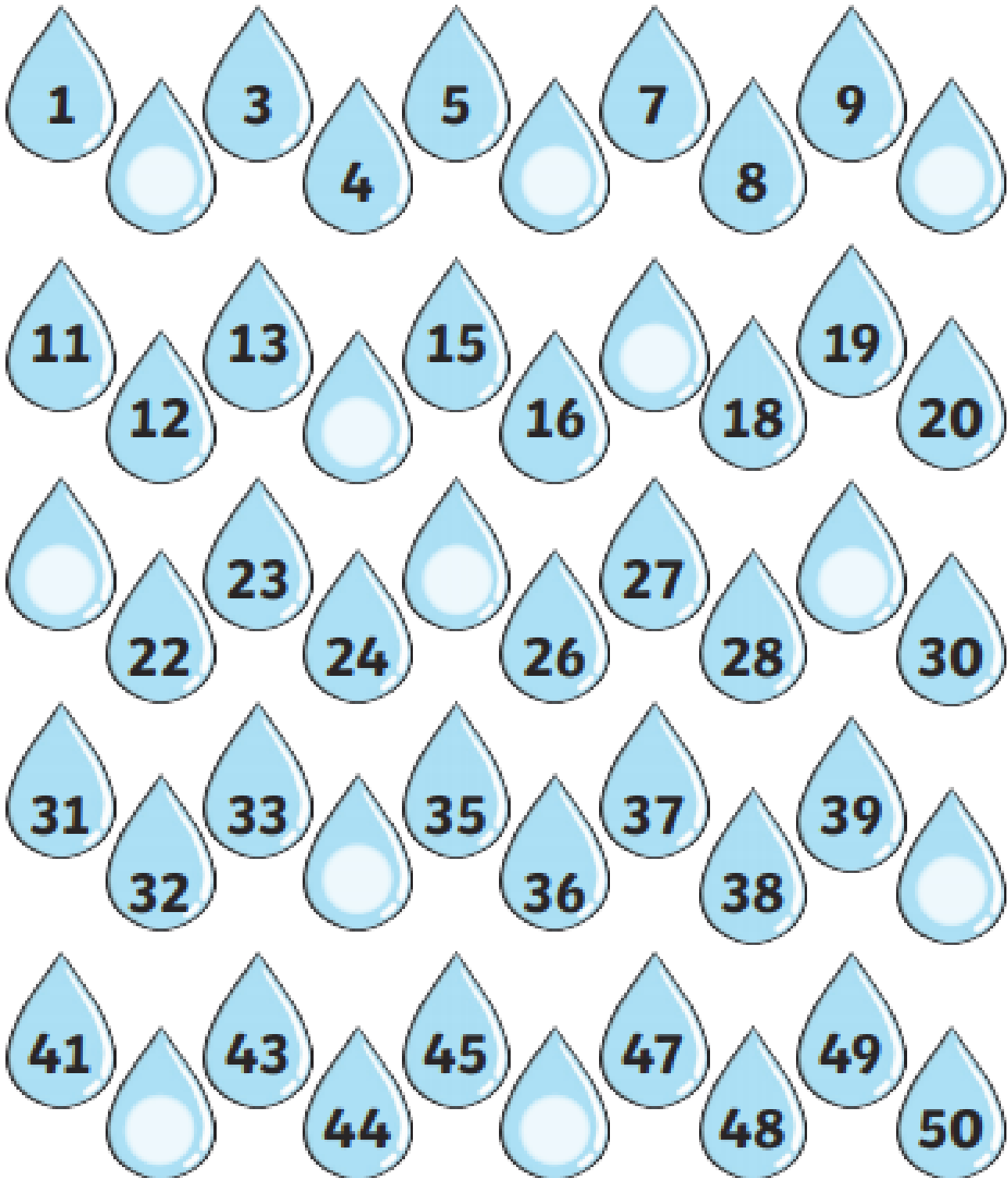


Now, can you add the tens and ones together to create the totals?

Challenge – How many ways can you make the total 50?

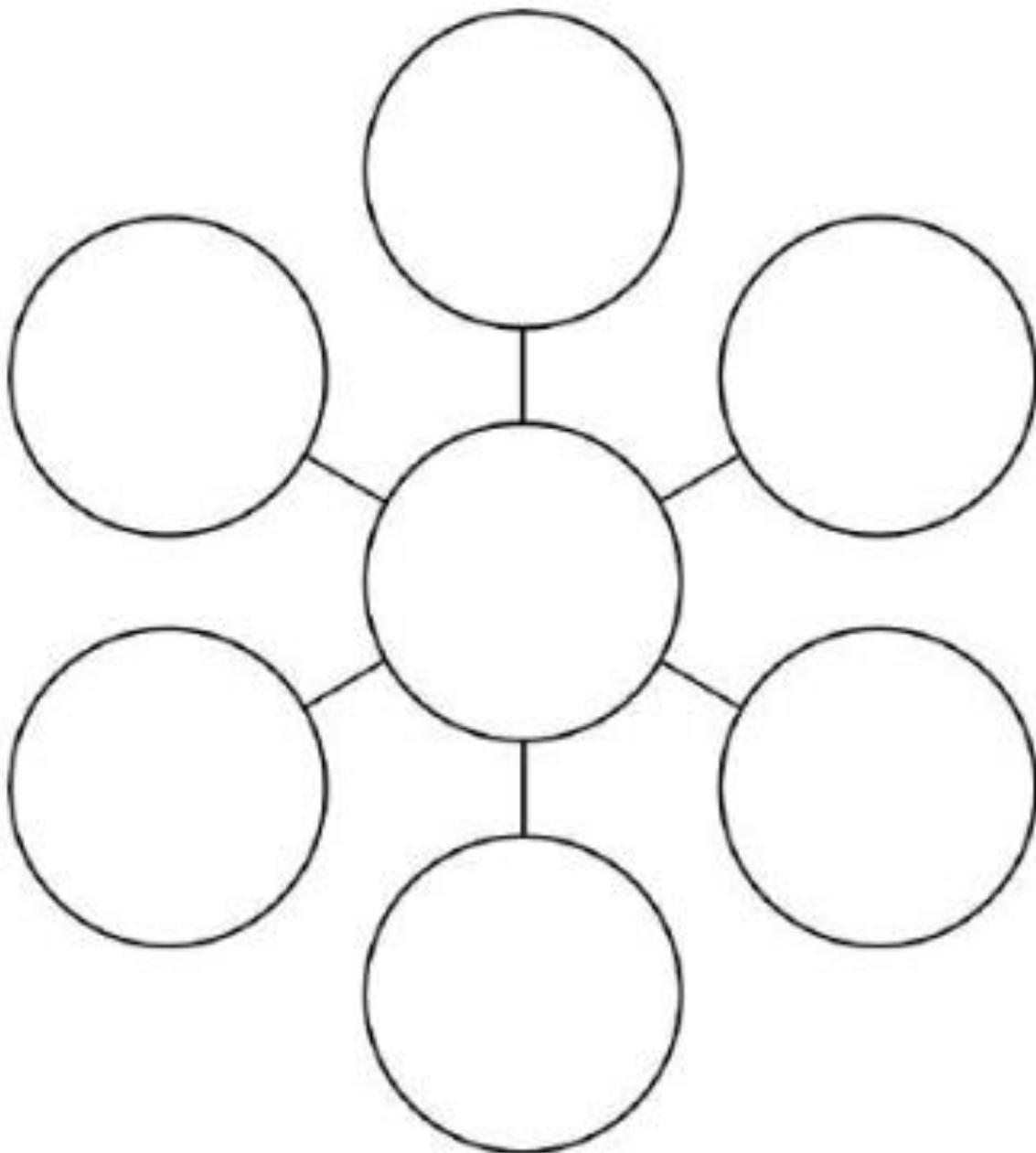

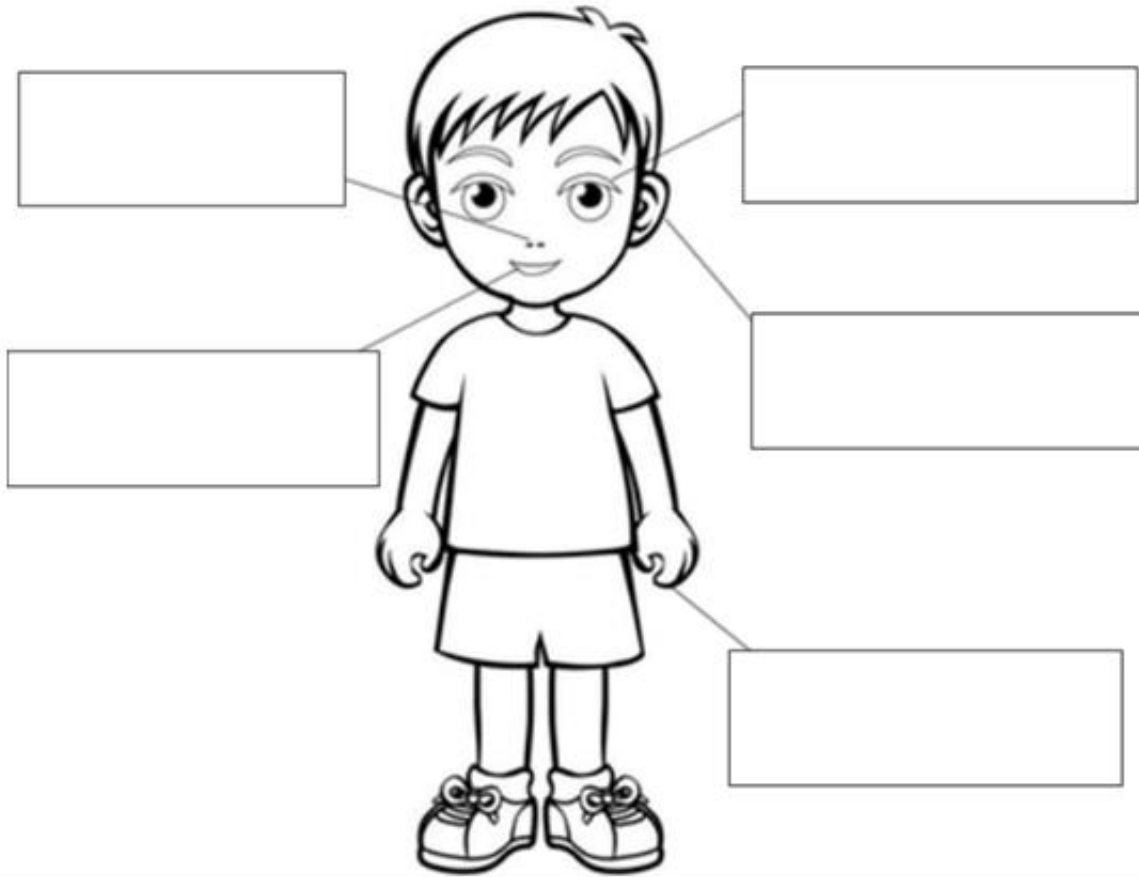
