Regular school attendance impacts positively on outcomes for pupils. Thank you to everyone that supports us in ensuring children are in school on time, everyday ready to learn.

We are working hard to ensure children are in school learning everyday. You can continue to help us to make sure they are and help us to achieve our whole school target of at least **97%** attendance.

School Uniform reminder

We expect all children (Nursery to Year 6) to attend school in full school uniform including black shoes, not trainers.

School uniform should be:

- ✓ Purple Jumper or cardigan with or without the school logo
- ✓ White polo shirt, white blouse or white shirt

- ✓ Grey trousers or skirt. Skirts should be knee length.
- ✓ Black shoes

Children should not wear jewelry to school. Where they have their ears pierced, they should only wear stud earrings which should not be worn on PE days. Where they are, the children will have to have them taped up.



PE Kit

All children should have a PE kit that they can use for PE. This should consist of:

- ✓ A white t-shirt – with or without the school logo
- ✓ Black shorts
- ✓ Black jogging bottoms and zip up hooded top for colder weather
- ✓ Trainers for outdoors (these do not need to be expensive branded trainers)
- ✓ Black pumps for indoor PE



All children are given a Slade water bottle when they join us in Reception. However, if you would like to purchase a new water bottle, you can do so from the school office at a cost of £1.

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
